CDP did not come to the city with preconceived notions in place to shape the small community. Instead, they are holding several meetings with Baptist Town residents and community members within the city of Greenwood to assess the strengths and needs of the community. The group allows participants to write ideas and comments on charts provided during meetings. "We are here to form a people's plan," said Ha. This approach allows everyone to have a voice. The main focus for the graduate students would be the sustainability of projects.

Also, Sherman Freeman, field liaison for community service/service learning, met with members of the CDP. "It's a good idea and something that is greatly needed in this area," said Freeman, who once lived in Baptist Town and understands the needs and challenges facing the community.

Freeman plans to meet with Mostaghimi to discuss possible service learning projects the University can assist with in the Baptist Town community.

CDP has outlined three phases they would like to implement in the community: raise awareness and build social capital, engage the Greenwood community in planning and help the Greenwood community implement their development plan and monitor progress. The organization has a two-year commitment to fulfill their goals.

CDP is providing their services to the community at no cost. "We are here to see what worked in the past and what didn't work," said Mostaghimi. "We are looking to build from the ground up," he added.
