

A native of Pontotoc, Sen. Cochran earned a B.A. degree with a major in psychology and a minor in political science from the University of Mississippi. In 1978, Cochran was elected to the United States Senate, becoming the first Republican in over 100 years to win a statewide election in Mississippi. He was re-elected in 1984 with more than 60 percent of the votes. In 1990, he was unopposed, and in 1996, he was re-elected to a fourth term in the Senate with over 70 percent of the votes. His margin of victory in the 2002 election was 85 percent.

He currently serves as Ranking Member of the full Appropriations Committee and the Homeland Security Appropriations Subcommittee. He also serves as a member of the Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry Committee and the Rules Committee.

Senator Cochran has been awarded honorary degrees from Kentucky Wesleyan College, Mississippi College, Blue Mountain College, the University of Richmond, and Tougaloo College. He is a member of the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution and the Kennedy Center Board of Trustees.

He is a member of Northminster Baptist Church in Jackson. He and his wife, the former Rose Clayton of New Albany, have two children and three grandchildren.
