For the first time since 1994 and only the second time in school history, the Delta Devils of Mississippi Valley State have claimed the Southwestern Western Athletic Championship in Men's Cross Country.

Led by Victor Bii, who won individually, the Delta Devils' demolished the nine-team field scoring 24 points outdistancing second place Grambling State

The Writings of Guamán Poma de Ayala" on Tuesday, Nov. 30 at 10 a.m. in the Business Education Auditorium.

Prior to joining MVSU in 2004, Varn taught in the Modern Languages Department at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, S.C. She has a distinguished career as a K-12 teacher in her native country of Panama and as a college professor that spans more than 20 years. She is the 2010 Best of Southern Conference on Language Teaching and the 2008 Best of Mississippi Foreign Language Association.



Dr. Varn began her college studies at the University of Panama where she completed her undergraduate degree in Spanish and education. After teaching for two years at a Catholic Mission School, she was selected in a national search as a recipient of a Fulbright Scholarship granted by the U.S. Embassy in Panama. She earned a master's degree and a doctorate degree in comparative literature with a concentration in Latin American literature from the University of South Carolina in Columbia, S.C. She has also attended summer seminars at the University of Salamanca, Spain. Dr. Varn has published numerous articles and presented at international, national, regional, and state conferences on issues that range from foreign language pedagogy to topics in Latin American literature.

She volunteers as an English as a second language instructor every week for the Hispanic community of Leflore County. Varn has organized free childcare for ESL students. She volunteers as a translator and interpreter for clergy and people in the community. She has taken students to study abroad programs and motivated others to participate in international programs. She has volunteered in Witness for Peace activities taking Spanish major students to participate in workshops on issues of peace and justice related to US and Latin American countries.

Dr. Varn and her husband, Dr. James Varn Jr., have two children, James and Estella. James is a junior at the University of Mississippi and Estella is a sixth grade student.

the 1992 "Showtime Comedy Club All Stars." Most recently Arnez was chosen to star in his own half hour special on Black Entertainment Television's "The Comic View."

Brown has performed in front of a variety of audiences including Kennedy Center Honors Richard Pryor, Def Comedy Jam Tour and she has toured with Bill Bellamy's "Who's Got Jokes" competition. She has appeared on nine consecutive seasons on BET's Comic View, twice being voted "Funniest Female" on the popular show and was reigning champion in the Comedy TKO on Showtime at the Apollo, and she has appeared on the Starz in Black comedy series "The 1st Amendment", produced by Martin Lawrence.

Last fall, TuRae made his debut on Comedy Central's Live at Gotham. With more than 10 stand up appearances on the BET network programs such as Comic View, The Sumner Report, One Mic Stand, and Partners in Crime, TuRae has become a recognizable face on the network and a favorite in the marketplace. The urban comedy magazine Humor Mill voted TuRae one of the Top Comedians of 2009 and also described TuRaes performance on the 2008 season of HBOs Def Comedy Jam as one of the funniest of the season. In 2009 TuRae delighted viewers on the nationally televised formats: the Starz Networks Martin Lawrence Presents; 1st Amendment Standup & Byron Allens Comics Unleashed.
