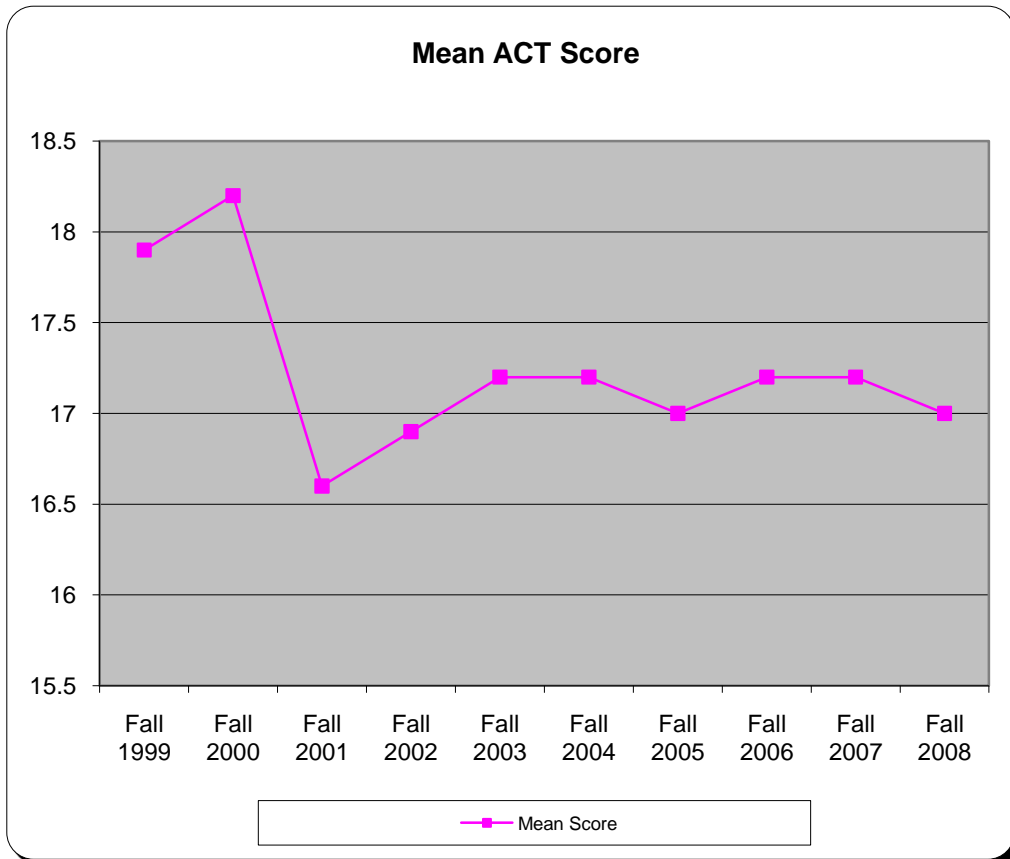

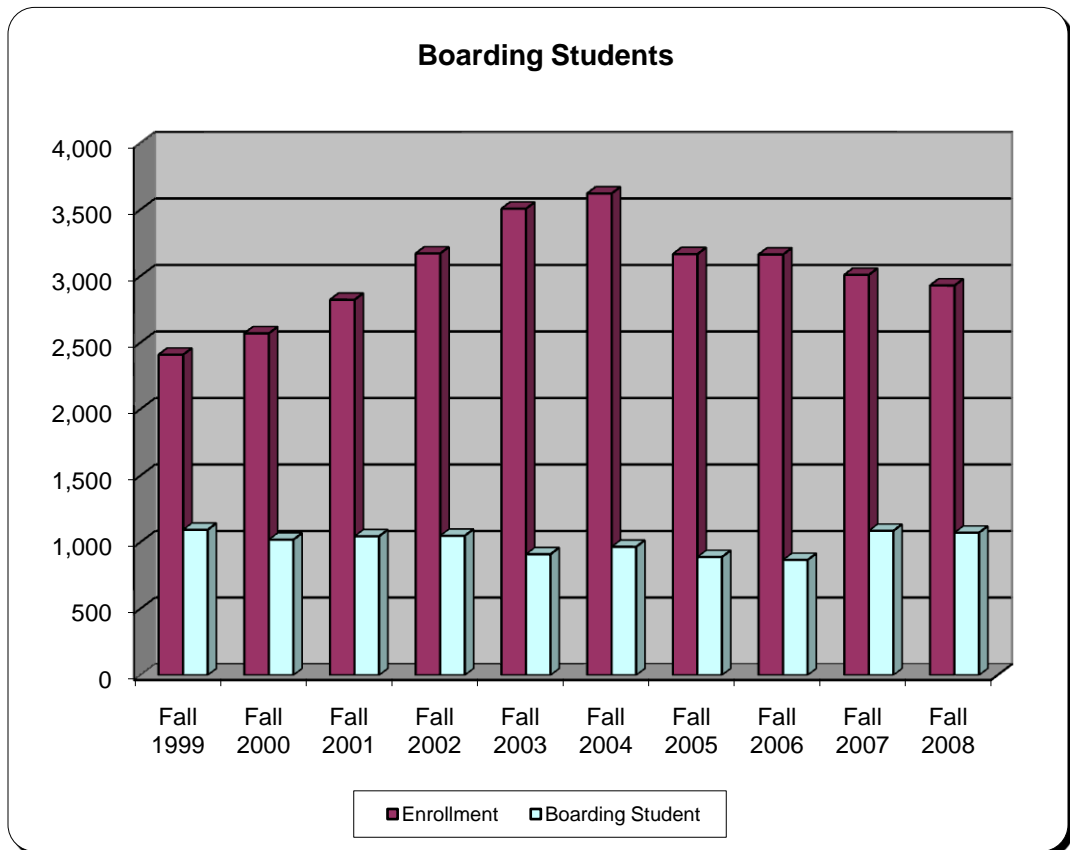

**BOARDING STUDENT ENROLLMENT: 10-YEAR TREND**

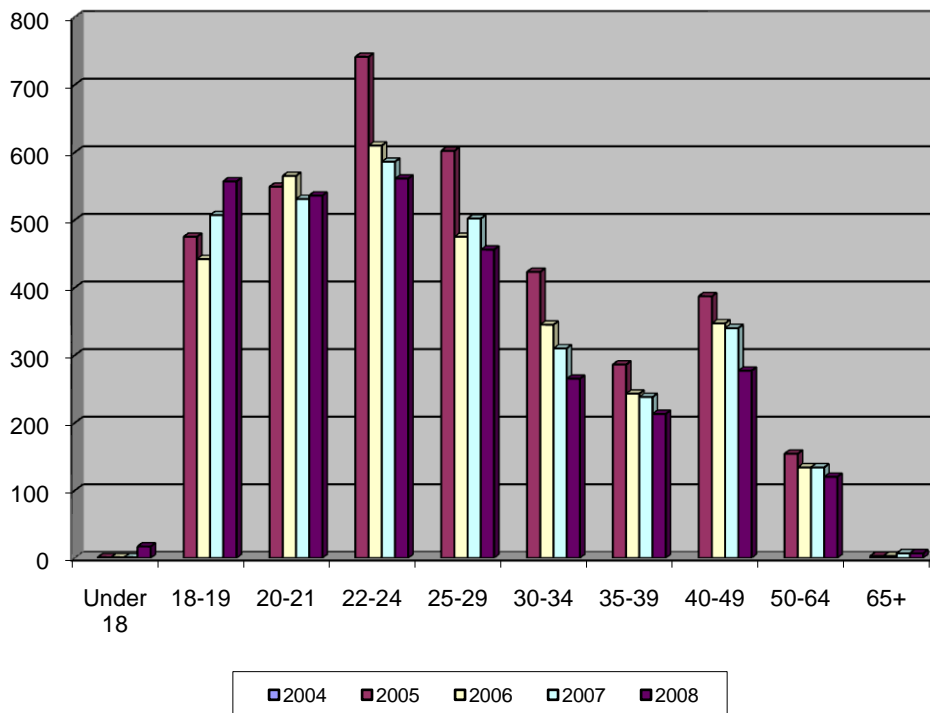
