

# Mississippi Valley State University

## Fall 2008 Enrollment Profile

- The Fall 2008 unduplicated enrollment of 2,929 students represents a decrease of 80 students (-2.7%) from Fall 2007. The unduplicated Spring 2008 enrollment was 2,911.
- Females make up 66% of total enrollment, 63% of undergraduate enrollment, and 82% of graduate enrollment.
- Sixty-three percent of students are commuters. Approximately 1,071 students live in campus housing.
- 2,340 students (80%) are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (867), Washington (395), Sunflower (332), and Bolivar (161) counties.
- Eleven percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 78% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 588 or 21% part-time students.
- There are 453 entering freshmen, representing a 4% increase over Fall 2007.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.3, up slightly from Fall 2007.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 344. The percentage enrollment of out-of-state students is 12%. Most of these students are from Illinois (68), Tennessee (54), and Texas (40) followed by Arkansas (29) and Georgia (29).
- White students make up 4% of the total enrollment. The number of White students currently stands at 107.
- Fifty-eight percent of undergraduates are under 25 years old, while only 15% of graduate students are under 25. However, 42% of undergraduates are over 25 years old, while 85% of graduate students are over the age of 25. Overall, 40% of the student body is age 25 or older.
- There are 678 new undergraduate students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 144 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 28% of the total enrollment.
- International enrollment is 24 and mostly includes students from Canada and Russia.
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Business Administration (298), Social Work (247), Elementary Education (237), HPER (210), and Early Childhood Education (206). The most popular graduate majors are Criminal Justice (175) and Social Work (55).
