Fall 2010 Enrollment Profile

- The Fall 2010 unduplicated enrollment of 2,636 represents a decrease of 214 students (-7.5%) from Fall 2009. The unduplicated Spring 2010 enrollment was 2,732.
- Females make up 64% of total enrollment, 62% undergraduate enrollment, and 74% of the graduate enrollment.
- Sixty-four percent of students are commuters. Approximately 960 students reside in campus housing.
- 2,095 of our currently enrolled students (80%) are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (737), Washington (348), Sunflower (273), Bolivar (154), and Holmes (118) counties.
- Eleven percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 69% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 535 or 20% part-time students.
- There are 394 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 415 entering freshmen in Fall 2009. This represents a (-1%) decrease.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.2. This is compared to an average of 17.3 in Fall 2009 and 17.7 in Spring 2010.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 284. The percentage of enrollment out-of-state students is 11%. Most of these students are from Illinois (61), Tennessee (58), and Texas (27) followed by Georgia (22), Arkansas (16) and Louisiana (16).

- White students make up 4% of the total enrollment. The number of White students decreased from Fall 2009 by 12 (11%). It stands at 98.
- There are 578 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 112 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 26% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 35. The majority are from Canada (20).
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Business Administration (264), Social Work (249), Biology (199), and HPER (190), followed by Early Childhood Education (173), and Elementary Education (171). The most popular graduate majors are Criminal Justice (150), Social Work (81), and MAT (72).
