Fall 2012 Enrollment Profile

- The Fall 2012 unduplicated enrollment of 2,479 represents an increase of 27 students or 2% from Fall 2011. The unduplicated Spring 2012 enrollment was 2,324.
- Females make up 63% of total enrollment, 61% of undergraduate enrollment, and 77% of the graduate enrollment.
- Sixty-six percent of students are commuters. Approximately 835 students reside in campus housing.
- Based on enrollment, 1,953 of our currently enrolled students or 79% are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (693), Washington (328), Sunflower (253), Bolivar (133), and Coahoma (106) counties.
- Sixteen percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 65% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 543 or 22% part-time students.
- There are 392 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 328 entering freshmen in Fall 2011. This represents an increase of 20% .
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.1. This is compared to an average of 17.2 in Fall 2011 and 17.0 in Spring 2012.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 285. The percentage of enrollment for out-of-state students is 12%. Most of these students are from Tennessee (77), Illinois (56) and California (24) followed by Georgia (23) and Louisiana (16).

- White students make up 4% of the total enrollment. The number of White students decreased from Fall 2011 by 4. White students' enrollment is 84.
- There are 619 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 114 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 30% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 34. The majority are from Canada (13).
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Business Administration (253), HPER (226), Social Work (224), and Biology (209), followed by Criminal Justice (196) and Early Childhood Education (188). The most popular graduate majors are Criminal Justice (86), Social Work (70), and MAT (39).
