Fall 2014 Enrollment Profile

- The Fall 2014 unduplicated enrollment of 2,222 represents an increase of 19 students or .86% from Fall 2013. The unduplicated enrollment for Spring 201 was 2,105.
- Females make up 59% of total enrollment, 57% of undergraduate enrollment, and 70% of the graduate enrollment.
- Fifty-seven percent of students are commuters. Approximately 966 students reside in campus housing.
- Based on enrollment, 1,542 of our currently enrolled students or 69% are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (519), Washington (206), Sunflower (198), Bolivar (124) and Humphreys (120) counties.
- Thirteen percent of undergraduates are parttime students while 58% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 432 or 19% part-time students.
- There are 399 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 493 entering freshmen in Fall 2013. This represents a 19% decrease.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.4. This is compared to an average of 17.1 in Fall 2013 and 17.5 in Spring 2014.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 432. The percentage of enrollment for out-of-state students is 19%. Most of these students are from Tennessee (83), Illinois

(76) and Georgia (49); followed by Florida(30) and California (29).

- Other Race students make up 5% of the total enrollment. Seventy of the Other Race students are White. White enrollment decreased from Fall 2013 by 7 students.
- There are 602 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 142 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 35% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 27. The majority are from **Kazakhstan**.
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Business Administration (236), HPER (225), Social Work (204), and Biology (186), followed by Criminal Justice (170) and Early Childhood Education (120). The most popular graduate majors are Masters of Business Administration (89), Social Work (82), and Criminal Justice (72).
