| <p>RL2.9-compare and contrast different versions of a book</p> | <p>Before I did this lesson I would read a Wolf Story: It is about a grandfather who tells a bedtime story to his grandson. He takes fairy tales about wolves and changes them but the grandson says, "that's not how it goes". I would read this to introduce the unit. I would talk about what stories have wolves and how are they are like in those stories.</p> <p>My bell ringer and introduction to this lesson would be a journal. Tell me what you know about the three little pigs.</p> <p>After they finish their journals, some will share.
