Spring 2015 Enrollment Profile

- The Spring 2015 enrollment of 2,138 students decreased by 84 students or -3.78% from Fall 2014. It represents a 1.54% increase from Spring 2014 with an enrollment of 2,105.
- Females make up 60% of total enrollment, 58% undergraduate enrollment, and 72% of the graduate enrollment.
- Sixty-three percent or (1,302) of students are commuters. Approximately 836 students reside in campus housing.
- 1,481 of our currently enrolled students (69%) are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (503), Washington (216), Sunflower (161), Bolivar (125) and Humphreys (110), followed by Holmes (95) and Coahoma (76).
- Fifteen percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 61% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 480 or 23% part-time students.
- There are 40 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 31 entering freshmen in the Spring of 2014.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.2. This is compared to an average of 17.4 in Fall 2014 and 17.5 in Spring 2014.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 402. The percentage of enrollment out-of-state students is 19%. Most of these students are from, Tennessee (78), Illinois

(68), Georgia (49), and California (29) followed by Florida (28) and Alabama (26).

- Other Race students make up 5% (104) of the total enrollment. The number of White students decreased by 5 students from Fall 2014. It now stands at 65 or 3%.
- There are 90 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 33 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 6% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 26. The majority are from Kazakhstan (7).
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Social Work (220), HPER (213), Business Administration (206), Biology (176), Criminal Justice (164), and Early Childhood Education (113). The most popular graduate majors are Social Work (91), Masters of Business Administration (88), Criminal Justice (76) followed by Rural Public Policy (30).
