Spring 2010 Enrollment Profile

- The Spring 2010 unduplicated enrollment of 2,732 represents a decrease of 118 students (-4.3%) from Fall 2009. The unduplicated Spring 2009 enrollment was 2,715.
- Females make up 66% of total enrollment, 63% undergraduate enrollment, and 80% of the graduate enrollment.
- Seventy percent of students are commuters. Approximately 833 students reside in campus housing.
- 2,189 of our current enrollment (80%) are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (777), Washington (376), Sunflower (308), Bolivar (166), and Humphreys (96) counties.
- Eleven percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 74% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 555 or 20% part-time students.
- There are 52 1st time freshmen compared to 57 entering freshmen in Spring 2009.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.7. This is compared to an average of 17.3 in Fall 2009 and 17.8 in Spring 2009.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 299. The percentage of enrollment out-of-state students is 11%. Most of these students are from Illinois (54), Tennessee (43), and Texas (31) followed by Georgia (21), Arkansas (18) and Louisiana (18).
- White students make up 4% of the total enrollment. The number of White students decreased from Fall 2009 by 16 (2%). It stands at 94.
- There are 129 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 47 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 7% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 27. The majority are from Canada.
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Business Administration (270), Early Childhood Education (222), Elementary Education (189), , HPER (184), followed by Biology (181) and Criminal Justice (174). The most popular graduate majors are Criminal Justice (147) and Social Work (83).
