


## **SPRING 2016 ENROLLMENT PROFILE**

- The Spring 2016 unduplicated enrollment of 2,114 students represents a decrease of 195 students, or -8.4%. It is 1.1% lower than the Spring 2015 enrollment of 2,138 students.
- 63% of students are commuters.
   Approximately 784 live on campus.
- 67% of students are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (515), Washington (206), Sunflower (165), Humphreys (111), and Bolivar (104) counties.
- 21% of students are from out-of-state. Most are from Tennessee (99), Illinois (68), and Georgia (50). There are 23 international students, most of whom are from Kazakhstan.

- 4% of students are Other-Race, including 58
   White students.
- There are 91 new students (73 undergraduate and 18 graduates) who represent 4% of total enrollment.
