Description: Graduate seminar class in environmental health is specialized interactive learning environment. - 2. Written intellectual autobiography from each student.
- 3. Collect the articles of interest and present for discussion.
- 4. Work with published results of interested topics.
- 5. Critique and discuss the research articles in class.
- 6. Acquire the knowledge to apply on the research projects.

Measurable outcomes for the EH 592

- 1. Will be able to demonstrate presentation skills through an assigned research topic.
- 2. Discuss confidently about the environmental health issues at national and international level.
- 3. Develop a set of problem solving skills through participation in debating session in class.
- 4. Develop a set of interactive communication, oral and written communication skills in the EH area.
- 5. Will be able to engage in solving a societal issue, which will be demonstrated through class presentation.
- 6. Will be a responsible and knowledgeable professional in environmental health arena.
